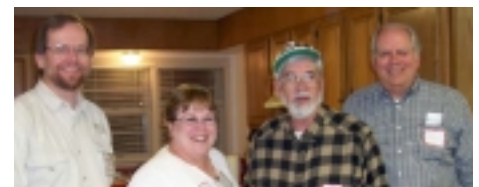

## From the Bench of Tom Criswell

In early June, 2000, I went with my family to Roaring River State Park. This trip was an introduction of my grandson and my soon to be grandson-in-law to the joys of trout fishing. As I was trying to help a couple of new fishermen learn the fishing for trout in Missouri Trout Parks, I did not plan on fishing myself in the morning hours. I am happy to say that both of the new fishermen caught a couple of trout shortly after the opening whistle.

The family wanted to go horseback riding around noon. I begged off, stating that I wanted to do some fly fishing, I went to the fly fishing section below the campground below Hwy. F bridge and rigged up. I walked to the handicap area and saw that there were a large number of fish in the large pool. Putting on a dry fly (Simple Adams) I began fishing. I saw a few fish rising, but did not see anything on the water. I got a few looks, but no takes.

After fishing about 15 minutes, I was joined by another fisherman. He proceeded to cast and quickly caught a fish. In the next 10 casts, he caught and released 6 fish. I still had not gotten a rise. I asked what he was using that was so successful and he showed me the fly. He called it the emerging caddis. As he offered me a fly to try, I tied it on and immediately began catching fish. Between the two of us we caught 15 to 20 fish in the next 50 minutes. As I needed to re-join my family for other activities, I thanked my benefactor and left him to his enjoyment.

## Emerging Caddis

The emerging caddis is a simple fly to tie and fish. Use a #18 fine wire hook for dry flies. Tie a small amount clear or cream Z-lon to the hook at the point of the bend. This simulated a shuck on a fly that is stuck in the film. This Z-lon should be held with a short amount in the left hand and the strand extending up the hook shank toward the eye. An easy way to get the shuck short enough is to tie it on with two turns (not tight). Before tightening the wraps, pull the strand extending toward the eye of the hook and adjust the length, then tighten the wraps. Following this, dub a small tapered body of Adams gray (possum fur or other dubbing) leaving enough space for a elk hair wing. Cut and stack some bleached elk hair to even the tips. Select enough of the elk hair to make a sparse wing. Tie the wing in as you would a elk hair caddis but keep the tips no longer than the bend of the hook. Trim the elk hair butts, cement, and take it fishing.
