MTFA Important Announcement - Membership Change

The E-Board will be presenting to all club members at the next meeting a change in club membership status for the upcoming year (2011) and beyond. The challenge that we face is that we have more retiree's on our roster than we have active paying members. Active members dues do not cover what the club is are paying for retired membership dues to the State organization and the FFF. Also the club pays for the cost of postage and printing for those members that do not use the internet when we send the newsletter and other announcements. The mailing cost has gone up substantially and is scheduled to go up again. After checking around with the other clubs, we found that all the club charge for membership regardless of status. A motion was made to change our dues as follows:

Retirees: \$10.00

Individual: \$15.00

Family: \$30.00 (which covers anyone in the family up to 18 years of age. When a child reaches their 18th birthday they will need to pay the individual membership due rate.)

The e-board voted unanimously for the change and recommends that the club members approve their recommendation.

Kansas City Sport Show - January 2011

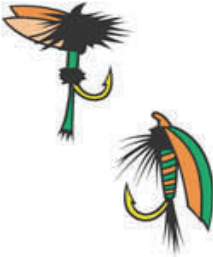

SILLIN RET. William Elwyn Sillin, 91, passed away August 6, 2010. Bill was born January 18, 1919 in Kansas City, Kansas to Charles and Mary Hylton Sillin. He received his Bachelors Degree from the College of the Ozarks. He served in the U.S. [Army](#) from 1941-1966 and was a veteran of [WWII](#), the Korean Conflict and Viet Nam War. After retiring, Bill spent his time teaching fly fishing and was an honorary member of the Trout Fisherman's Association. He was a member of Barry Christian Church. Bill was preceded in death by his first wife, Dorothy in 1995; his parents and brothers and sisters. Survivors include his wife, Betty Jo; his children, Rhonda Leach and Robert Sillin; 4 step-children, Diana Roberts, Steven Ballard, Ronald D. Ballard and Charles Apple; brother, John Sillin; 16 grandchildren; 24 great- grandchildren, nieces, nephews and many friends.

Book Review:

Til Death or Fly Fishing Do Us Part by Thomas R. Pero

Wild River Press, Mill Creek, WA, 2009

168 pages, Hardcover, illustrated B&W, suggested price \$24.95

An interesting collection of stories by fly fishing spouses and fly fishers regarding personal relationships versus fly-fishing. These are nicely written essays. Several are at times humorous.
