Project Healing Waters Report by Jim Kissane PHWFF Adds National Fly Casting Competition to 2018 Activities List

Time to polish up your casting stroke! Project Healing Waters Fly Fishing has announced a new event for 2018, a National Fly Casting Competition, with finalists from every region competing at the Fly Fishers International Fly Fishing Fair Aug. 8-11 at Boise, ID.

The competition is open to all active Project Healing Waters participants. Casters will be scored on distance and accuracy, including casting around obstructions.

Contestants must use a 5-weight fly rod with a maximum length of 9 feet, and a 5-weight fly line and 9foot leader. No markings other than manufacturer's markings may appear on the line. Casters will use a #10 Elk Hair Caddis with the bend of the hook removed; a piece of yard no longer than one inch may be used instead of the fly. Bright colors are recommended to contrast with the casting surface.



Competition begins at the program level, with program winners determined by May 31. Regional competition will take place in June, with each regional champion receiving an invitation to the PHWFF Casting Competition Finals during the International Fly Fishing Fair. Travel expenses will be paid by Project Healing Waters.

First, Second and Third Place winners will be recognized at an awards ceremony. Prizes will be announced at a later date.

Back in July last year, our chapter secretary, Ardith Haynes, was asked to follow-up on an email received by Bill Beckman from Mr. Carl Pfaff of Woodstock, GA. This is Ardith's story.

Carl had inherited several rods from his father, and among them one built by Bill Sillin, one of our MTFA members. He had learned of our club from Joe Roope, whom his father had worked for. He wished to know more about Bill Sillin, master bamboo fly rod builder.

That was how I received the honor of interviewing Betty Sillin about her deceased husband. When Carl read over this interview, he was moved to offer the rod back to Betty. Bill had offered to build her one, but that hadn't happened.

In October. UPS delivered the tube to my doorstep. A few days later, we placed the rod into Betty's hands. Tears were in her eyes as she ran a finger along the grain of the wood and talked about Bill's passion for perfection. She immediately wanted to thank Mr. Pfaff and dictated a letter to him.

"Dear Mr. Carl:

Thank you so much for your consideration in sending me the rod that my husband Bill made. It is such a pleasure to hold it in my hand and look at the fine workmanship done on it.

One day next spring I hope to go to Bennett Springs MO and use it myself. Before Bill died we had reservations to go down there and fish one last time, but that didn't happen. But in the meantime, my friend Dave is going to use it in our honor at Bennett Springs.

Ardith then sent this letter to Mr. Pfaff


