Christmas Gift Ideas for the Angler in Your Home

<u>Sling Packs</u>. These are really great packs. Light weight, good storage areas and easy to move from your back to your chest. These vary in price from \$59 to \$120. (Simms, Orvis, Umpqua, Fishpond and Patagonia have great packs)

<u>Fishpond Dakota Carry on Rod and Reel Case.</u> The ultimate carry-on bag for the traveling angler is a must. Prices vary from \$179.95 – \$219.95.

<u>Simms or Abel Nippers.</u> USA made machined-aluminum nipper with razor-sharp stainless steel jaws. Simms next-generation Guide Nippers combine aerospace-grade aluminum architecture with surgically-sharp jaws for ideal performance with light to heavy mono or fluoro leaders and tippets. Details include 6061-T6 machined aluminum arms and riveted, stainless-steel cutters.

Simms or Abel Guide Pliers. Simms superior Guide Pliers put rusty, decrepit needle-nosers on notice. Able

Pliers and the Hatch Nomad Pliers are similar. These are the top of the line pliers that almost every guide has on their wader belt. \$269.95 to \$300.00.

<u>Tippet.</u>- Every fisherperson can always use tippet, in sizes 4x, 5x, 6x and 7x. If he/she doesn't have a tippet holder that attaches to the vest or pack they use, get that with the tippet spools.

<u>Tapered Leaders</u> - Some fisherpersons make their leaders but having some ready to attach to your fly line is really nice. They come in different lengths but around here the most common is a 5x, 6x, and 7x (9'-0" long). Great to have in your vest or pack.

<u>Leader Wallet - Really handy to keep your store bought or hand made leaders organized.</u>

<u>Clip On Magnifying Glass</u> - As we get older this is great for us anglers. A clip on magnifying glass for the hat. A really helpful tool for tying knots and small flies on small tippet.



Waterproof Camera - So many people are using the camera on their phones instead of using a good digital camera. I really don't like carrying my phone out on the water unless I'm in a boat and then I put it in a dry bag. A good waterproof digital camera is what every fisherperson needs. You can take pictures or video underwater of the catch or release of the your catch and you do not care if it gets wet. Most of these cameras are WiFi which is really nice. The #1 rated waterproof camera is the Olympus TG-6, #2 - GoPro Hero 8 or 7, #3 - Nikon Coolpix, #4 - Ricoh WG60. These cameras range from \$230-\$399.

<u>Tutorial DVD</u> - A good DVD on casting, fly tying or fishing technique's is a great gift to receive. There is nothing better to do on a cold winter's day but to pop in a video and learn from some of the best anglers, casters and fly tyers of our sport.

Orvis Sure Step Wading Staff. This folding wading staff offers balance and confidence while fishing in high water. They have three or four different wading staffs available and prices range from \$59 - \$149.

<u>Yeti Mugs.</u> For many anglers, the fishing day can't start without coffee. I am amazed at how the Yeti mugs will keep coffee hot for a long time. Their coolers are also unbelievable and the Yeti products are everywhere from Bass Pro to Westlake Hardware. Check them out.

A fly assortment. A great stocking stuffer or a fill in gift. In our area, K&K fly shop has a great assortment of flies and the staff will help you pick the right flies for our local waters.

A Gift Certificate. If you can not decide what to give your favorite angler, a gift certificate from the local fly shop will allow them to pick out what they want or maybe apply it to a item.

A Trip of a Lifetime. Why not give them cash toward a trip of a lifetime to a world class destination! Alaska, British Columbia, Bahamas, Montana, Arkansas, New Mexico or Michigan? Check out some of the hosted trips that K&K sponsors. There are other fly shops around the country that put hosted trips together. I have personally used FishWest (www.fishwest.com) and Durangler's (duranglers.com).


